Abstract submission guidelines

You are asked to follow the guidelines below when submitting an abstract for oral or poster presentation. Abstracts which indicate TBC (to be confirmed) in any field will not be accepted. Abstracts will not be proofread prior to printing so you are strongly advised to ensure there are no typing errors before submission.

Title

The title should be as brief as possible; preferably one line.

Authors

The main (presenting) author's name should be marked with an asterisk (*).

Affiliations

Authors and their corresponding affiliation should be indicated with numbers. (Example, John Smith¹ and ¹Science College of Medicine).

Text

Abstracts should be approx 500-800 words or no more than one page.

The formatting of figures, graphs and schemes will be lost during submission and is not recommended. Write out any special characters (including Greek characters) in your text.

Single spacing should be used throughout.

References, denoted by numbers in the text, should be listed at the end of the text using standard Chemical Abstracts Source Service Index terminology followed by YEAR, VOLUME, and PAGE.

General

Abstracts which most closely fit with the themes of the meeting will be selected. A scientific committee will review the abstracts and those selected to present will be notified by e-mail. Abstracts submitted, but not chosen for oral presentation will automatically be listed as poster presentations.

You will be advised of the duration, time and day of your presentation or the dimensions of the poster board.

All abstracts will be produced into a book of abstracts and made available to delegates at the meeting. *Please note this does not constitute publication* and abstract books are not available for sale following the meeting*.*
